## HUSBAND AND WIFE TEAM OPTIMIZING PATIENT EXPERIENCE FOR OPTOMETRY PRACTICE

Any time of the day, from his optometry practice two buildings away, Dr. Russell L. Doerksen can peer out the window at what will soon be his expanded Doerksen & Associates Family Practice Optometry. It's not unusual for him to pop in a couple times a day, checking progress and asking questions. "My office is literally 500 yards away from the construction site," he said.

After 21 years serving patients at Reflection Ridge Office Park, Dr. Doerksen is expanding his practice with an eye on convenience and patient experience. The project is a collaborative effort between him and his wife Kate, who also works for the American Red Cross. "She's in charge of the patient experience, and I'm in charge of the clinical side," he said. Together they're working with the Simpson team to create a contemporary spa-like feel for patients. The project was designed by Shelden Architecture.

Simpson Project Manager Chris Baalman said the high-end optometry center will feature a wooden reception counter with quartz top, and Dover shell limestone eyeglass display cases. Energy-efficient LED lighting produce an excellent light quality as well as cost savings for the owner.

Frequent visits reflect the owner's focus on quality. "Dr. Doerksen typically comes in a couple times a day, either during the lunch hour or after work," said Chris. "He's very professional, he wants it done right."

The office will double in size to allow for future growth, and is designed with an upbeat, contemporary style and an expanded frame selection in the optical center. "We will eventually add a second optometrist," said Doerksen, and some additional technology to keep patient care on the cutting edge.


In addition to the doctor's on-site presence, Simpson Superintendent Brad Cragun and Baalman attend meetings with the owners every other week, which keeps the project goal-oriented. "Chris and Brad are amazing. Chris has been very easy to work with and is very good at communication," Doerksen noted. The expansion is targeted for a spring opening.

# STUDENTS COME FIRST IN NORTHWEST HIGH SCHOOL PROJECT

Safety, security and student development are at the center of
Northwest High School's phased renovation and addition now underway.

Principal Gil Alvarez says that the project is a recommitment to the
school's student-focused mission, its emphasis on career
and technology education (CTE), and its dedication
to preparing students for a future





in business.

"We want to upgrade our CTE and business courses, to create for students a pathway for the future," said Alvarez. "Our goal is to provide state-of-the-art classrooms so they have a strong foundation for achieving the life they want."

The 65,000 square-foot addition and 44,000 square-foot renovation includes transforming the existing business classrooms from one large open classroom to five dedicated classrooms, plus the addition of two more. The additions will include space for Northwest's yearbook and journalism programs. Students will also benefit from an upgrade of the athletic facility, including a new

state-of-the-art running track and a gymnasium accommodating 2,300. One of the school's three basketball courts will be renovated to create a wrestling room.

On par with its preparatory mission is the school's devotion to safety, with the gymnasium and band room dually designed to serve as storm shelters, said Simpson Senior Project Manager Josh Vogel. "Double-width masonry walls with brick on the outside and steel joists will create a durable and long-lasting structure," said Vogel. Also, a new secure entrance will ensure that all guests check in at the office.

Northwest High has continued normal operations throughout the project, and Alvarez said the Simpson team and school officials come together for bi-weekly meetings at USD 259 offices. "Our goals are two-fold, the first is to make sure that the end results fit the needs of students, the second is to ensure that we're still functioning as a school and educating our kids as we progress," he said. The project will complete in phases, beginning this summer and with final completion slated for summer 2016.
